6th February – You are the judges

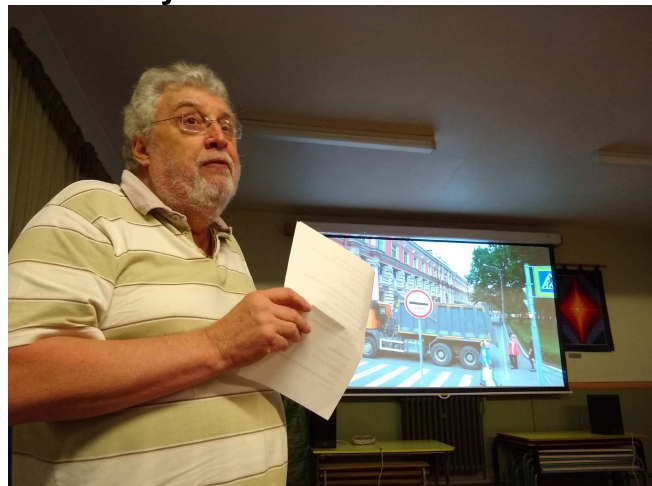
